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Commissioner's Letter

The 68th season of the Roland Park Baseball Leagues comes to a conclusion this Saturday at the League Clubhouse, aka Belvedere Square.

This week we are concluding the end of season playoffs in our National, American and Teen Leagues. In the National League, the Pilots and Toppers were squaring off on Wednesday night. In the American League, the Wolfpack and the Vikings will face off on Thursday night. In the Teen League, the Rams forced a winner take all championship game on Thursday night by outlasting the Cubs on Wednesday in 8 exciting innings in beautiful Gilman Stadium. Championship and runner-up trophies will be presented on Saturday.



Friday night will be our end of season All Star Games. The National League and American League All Star games will take place at the Druid Hill Bowl Fields. Two National League games kicking off at 6pm, and the two American League games scheduled for 8pm. This is a great evening of baseball that will include concessions provided by the 12U Cooperstown Travel Team. On the menu this year are some great options such as hamburgers, veggie burgers, hot dogs, chili, taco in a bag, blackened chicken Caesar salad, baked goods, candy, chips and beverages. There will also be an ice cream truck with a portion of all proceeds going to the team.

The Teen League All Star game will take place at Swann Field with first pitch at 7:30pm. This is a great spot to watch a game with the field located by the Patapsco River and definitely worth the trip to South Baltimore to take in this game.

Hall of Fame Ceremony Recap

A very special thank you to all who were involved in another very special RPBL Hall of Fame Ceremony on June 1st at Springwell and Memorial Field. Some of the highlights include:

- Hall of Fame inductee Bob Wood was Skyped in from Jackson, WY. He spoke of a grey February day in 1952 when he attended the founding meeting of RPBL with Merwin Jacobsen, Allen Barrett, and his father Graham Wood. It was held at Roland Park Presbyterian Church. His details of the early part of the league, from Gilman's early help with fields to the laundering of the flannel uniforms in the off season, were terrific to hear.
- Also inducted was Chris Downs, who coached the Cavaliers for over twenty years, and came head to toe in Cavalier blue, including powder blue socks and Chuck



Taylor's.

- The third inductee was Allen Barrett, whose son Mac spoke of the reverence his father held for the League and the bond they shared over baseball. Mr. Barrett was a decorated WW II veteran and contributed to the community around him in very meaningful ways. The scoreboard at Gilman's baseball field bears his name.
- The final inductee was long time umpire Curtis Greene. Tyrone Hill, who introduced him, spoke of how youth sports can change the world, telling the story of how young baseball players played an inspiring role in the integration of his local little league when he was a boy, and why being an umpire is so important to he and Curtis.

Following the ceremony, the inductees threw out the first pitch for the Tigers-Shamrocks playoff game at Memorial Field.

A very special thank you to everyone who helped make this special day happen including Phil Golden, Heather Entwistle, and the rest of the team at Springwell for their wonderful hospitality in hosting this ceremony.
